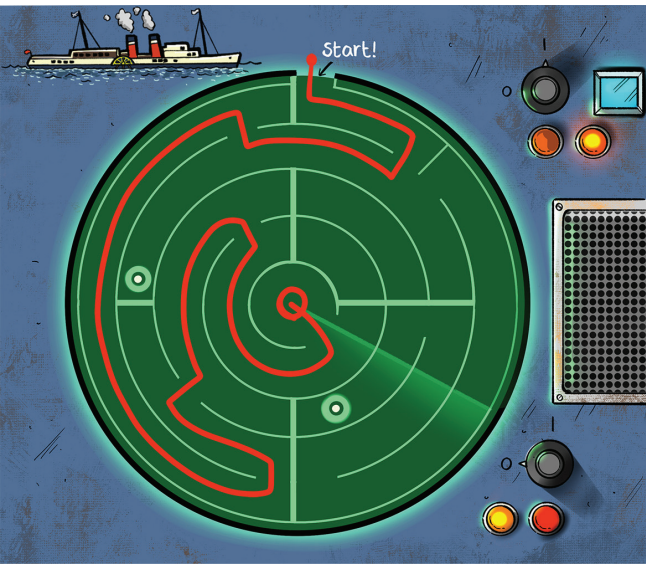
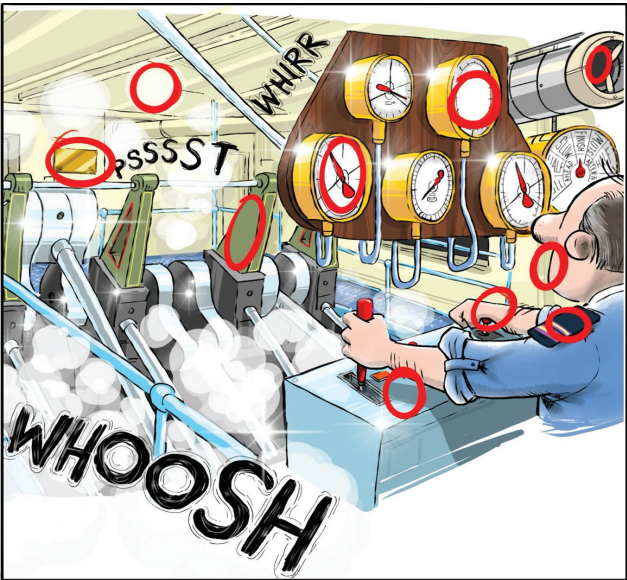

Hunt the Object:



Destination Board: There are two destination boards, one on either side of the ship. They are situated on the side of the ship on the deck above the Caledonia Tea Room. They show all the day's calling points.



Eagle Symbols: The eagles can be seen in the engine room towards the front of the ship, with one small brass eagle on each of *Waverley's* three massive steel pistons. The eagles are the symbol of the company that manufactured the engines - Rankin & Blackmore's Eagle Foundry in Greenock.



Jeanie Deans Ship's Bell: This is in a glass case on the wall of PS *Jeanie Deans* Lounge situated toward the front of the ship. The *Jeanie Deans* was a sister ship of the *Waverley* but much older, built in 1931 at Fairfield's, Govan. It left the Clyde in 1964 and sailed briefly on the Thames before being scrapped in 1967.



Auxiliary Steering Wheel: This is at the stern (back) of the ship. It can be used if the main steering system operated from the Bridge ever broke down.
